1. Earned a minimum of 24 credits with an overall G.P.A. of 2.0.
2. To include ENG 111 College Composition I (3 credits) and ENG 112 College Composition II (3 credits) with a minimum grade of C.
3. To include a minimum (any combination) of 2 courses in the major or minor (area students will be teaching in) with a minimum of C+ grade in each.

### SPECIAL EDUCATION MAJOR / SECONDARY TEACHING CERTIFICATION

Students seeking to major in Special Education must fulfill the requirements for a bachelor's degree, requirements for a teaching certificate at the secondary level and advanced preparation in educating students with cognitive impairments (CI) or emotional impairments (EI). Students majoring in Special Education are subject to all Teacher Education Program policies and procedures.

Completion of the following sequence of courses will result in teacher certification at the secondary level, and an endorsement in Emotionally Impaired or Cognitively Impaired. A Master of Arts in Teaching Degree and an endorsement in Learning Disabilities is available.

- I. General Education  
35 hours in 10 areas; described in SVSU's online catalog under Baccalaureate Degree Requirements
- II. Professional Education Requirements  
Following admission to the College of Education Teacher Education Program, students majoring in Special Education are required to follow the sequence for Professional Studies described under Secondary Teaching.
- III. In addition to the Special Education Professional Studies requirements, Special Education majors at the secondary level must complete either:
  - a. An approved major listed under Secondary Teaching Certification  
or
  - b. Two (2) minors from the approved list of minors under Secondary Teaching Certification.

Students electing to exit from the Special Education Major prior to completion of Special Education Professional Studies and seeking certification for regular Secondary Education must meet requirements for approved majors/minors listed under Secondary Certification. It is recommended that these students contact the College of Education Office of Admissions and Certification at (989) 964-4057 ext. 3 for an advising appointment to update their program plan.
