Attendance

Attendance is critical to your success in this course. This is a skills course, not a lecture course, so you must be here. Because I cannot -- and don't want to -- judge what are acceptable or unacceptable reasons for missing class, I do not distinguish between "excused" and "unexcused" absences. You should be here every day. Of course, emergencies arise, but you may not miss more than **six/eight hours** of course instruction (two class periods for once a week classes and four for twice a week classes). This is the English Division policy, not mine, and it is strictly enforced. Your grade will be affected by absences.

Additionally, it is important for you to know that many divisions at Delta, including the English Division, have adopted a policy that students who fail to attend the first class session will be immediately dropped from the course. Attending college is a privilege and an expense to both students and the taxpayers who support education. Many courses have waiting lists, and seats will be reserved only for serious students who wish to both learn and attend.

Note: I, like all Delta instructors, reserve the right to drop students from this course for lack of attendance, or for failing to complete the required coursework. Also see "*Delta College Attendance Policy*" in your handbook.

Missing Class

- If you do elect to miss a class, it is your responsibility to gather information about what you missed from other students.
- No work may be “made up” outside of class. If you miss class or in-class work, you will miss valuable points.
- In the event of severe or prolonged illness, injury, or crisis, if your extended absence will lead to your earning less than what you find an acceptable grade in the course, you should drop the class and re-take it in a coming semester.

Tardiness

Class starts promptly at our scheduled time. Two late arrivals or early departures will equal one absence. **Note: Arriving to class still needing to print your work for the day is unacceptable. Be prepared for class when you arrive.**

Policy on Late Work: Late work will not be accepted. Period. You must complete your assignments, and you must complete them on time.

- If you are unable to attend class on the day an assignment is due, please make arrangements with me beforehand so that I have a copy of your assignment in-hand before the start of class on the due date. I do not accept e-mailed copies of work.

Other Course Policies

- Always bring your texts and all course work to class.
- Prepare all daily reading assignments *before* coming to class.
- You **MUST** complete each of the major papers to complete this class. You **MUST** complete the reading for this class. You cannot pass this class without reading.
- Certain course activities and policies may be revised at my discretion. The course schedule is a plan, but the course reflects your needs and concentrates on areas where you need work.

Academic Dishonesty
