- Use Janson's *History of Art* (Reference N5300 .J3), Adam's *Art Across Time* (Reference N5300 .A3), and Gardner's *Art Through The Ages* (Reference N5300 .G25) - ask at the Reference Desk.
- Use **Michigan Library websites (Catalogs)**, available from the [Delta Library website \(Suggested Library Websites\)](#), to locate books that you can interlibrary loan from SVSU, U of M, Library of Michigan and others - ask at the Reference Desk.

- Use *SIRS Renaissance*, available from the [Delta Library website \(Journals and Magazines\)](#) - off campus requires Delta user ID and password.
- Use *JSTOR*, available from the [Delta Library website \(Journals and Magazines\)](#) - off campus requires Delta user ID and password.
