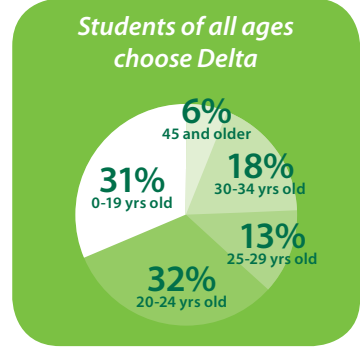
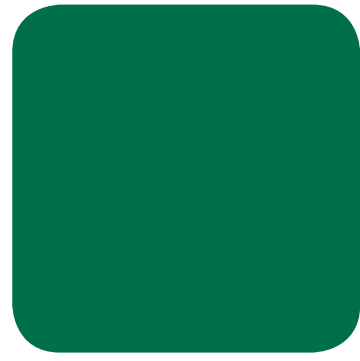




FUNDING YOUR EDUCATION

An exceptional value

The annual cost to attend Delta College is nearly half the average cost at a public four-year university – and that doesn't include room and board. Still, paying for college can be difficult so the Financial Aid and Student Finance offices work together to provide valuable assistance to help you finance this investment in your future. In addition to our low tuition rates, we offer a wide range of federal, state and institutional financial aid programs, awarding over \$18 million in aid annually. Also, a convenient, interest-free payment plan is available, allowing students to spread the cost of their tuition and fees over multiple payments.



FINANCIAL AID BY THE NUMBERS

In 2008-2009, **60%** of all Delta students **received** some type of **financial aid**

Delta endowed and institutional scholarships – **\$389,767** to **397** students (\$981/student)

Community scholarships – **\$609,958** to **456** students (\$1337/student)

Federal Stafford loans – comprised almost **\$9 million** in student aid.
2,556 students borrowed an average of \$3521.

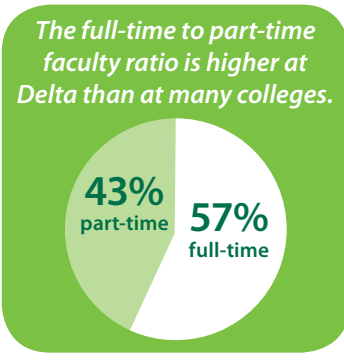
