CALL TO ORDER Board Chair Emrich called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA Board Chair Emrich asked for a motion to approve the agenda. M. Benecke made a

motion to approve the agenda with support from M. Nash. The motion passed

unanimously.

PUBLIC COMMENT Board Chair Emrich called for public comment.

TREASURER'S REPORT D. Lutz said that the Board has received the College financial statements for the month

ended June 30, 2017. The fiscal year has ended but the books are not final yet. The College is in a strong cash position. State funding is higher than expected due to the methodology that was used for personal property tax reimbursement to Colleges. In addition, the College had wage and benefit dollars that were budgeted, but not spent due to vacancies. In addition, the College came in under budget in its self-funded medical insurance expenses. The College ended the year "in the black" and in a favorable financial

position. The final numbers will be presented in November.

It is the recommendation of the Administration that the Board of Trustees approve the elimination of the Retail Management Advanced Certificate and Associate Degree in Business Studies.

M. Nash made a motion to approve the recommendation. M. Morrissey seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

STUDENT SUCCESS

Margaret Mosqueda, Vice President of Student and Educational Services introduced this evening's presenters: Michelle White; Destyn Grace, AmeriCORP Vista Worker; and Amanda Jordan, Student.

Michelle White presented a history and overview of the AmeriCORP Vista Worker program at Delta College. She introduced Destyn Grace, current AmeriCORP Vista Worker, and Amanda Jordan, Student, who talked about the benefits of both the AmeriCORP program, as well as the College's Volunteer Incentive Program (VIP). The VIP program aims to bridge the gap between Delta College students and the community. Amanda Jordan shared the positive effects that being involved in the VIP program have had on her experience as a Delta student.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Enrollment Report

Registration for the Fall 2017 Semester began on Tuesday, April 11. To-date, 7,778 students have registered (4,878 part-time, 2,900 full-time).

Fall classes begin on August 26.

Information Sharing

 Dr. Goodnow said that she was saddened to learn of the passing of Dr. John Fuller, former Delta College Registrar and Chair of the College's Board of Trustees. Dr. Fuller remained committed to Delta throughout most of his professional life, retiring in 1988 after serving as Registrar since 1970. He served on the Delta College Board of Trustees from 1989 to 2000, filling the roles of Chair and Vice Chair during his tenure.

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He and his wife, Joanne, also established the Dr. John and Joanne Fuller Scholarship Endowment at Delta College. As Delta's Registrar, he worked hard to modify, upgrade and improve the College's registration and permanent record systems. He served as Senate President in 1973 and received the Don Laughner Award for Creative Change, which is awarded to an employee who makes "contributions that result in significant change in the institution," in 1988.

- Dr. Goodnow shared that Dr. Reva Curry, our Vice President of Instruction and Learning Services, has been nominated and elected to the Michigan Ace Women's Network Board of Directors for a three-year term for her leadership, talents, experience, and expertise.
- Dr. Crystal Starkey, English Associate Professor and PTK Advisor received the Paragon Award for New Advisors from Phi Theta Kappa. She was recognized for her efforts in increasing membership of our local chapter, mentoring individual members in their personal growth, and for her encouragement for the chapter to volunteer for events both on and off campus. Congratulations Dr. Starkey!
- Dr. Goodnow announced that Board Vice Chair, Diane Middleton, has been promoted to Vice President of Operations at the Midland Area Chamber of Commerce.

Dr. Goodnow thanked all three Trustees for their commitment and dedication to Delta College.

- D. Middleton thanked the 3 Trustees (M. Rowley, R. Emrich, and K. Lawrence-Webster) who celebrated service milestones this year.
- D. Middleton also discussed the MCCA Summer Conference. She said it was a wonderful conference. She mentioned the joint statement of AACC and ACCT on Equity and Diversity. She encourage the Trustees to read it and said that perhaps the Trustees could adopt something similar moving forward.

She said that Noah Brown, ACCT, was at the MCCA Summer Conference. He shared a long list of proposals by the Trump Administration that would mean cutbacks to education programs. D. Middleton said that it is important for all of us to stay informed and in touch with our legislators.

Finally, D. Middleton discussed the impactful presentation that was delivered by Wes Moore. She said the conference programming was impressive.
