CALL TO ORDER	Board Chair Gannon called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.
APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA	Board Chair Gannon asked for a motion to approve the agenda. M. Wood made a motion to approve the agenda. A. Baldwin seconded the motion. Motion to approve the agenda passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT	J. Foco said that the Board has received the financial statements for the month ending August 31, 2026. There are no variances to report at this time. He reminded the Board that the State of Michigan does not make any state aid payments during August or September. The finance team is working with the auditors who are onsite this week. APPROVAL OF INCREASES TO THE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT ALLOWANCE (PDA) FOR SUPPORT STAFF AND ADMINISTRATIVE/PROFESSIONAL STAFF (BA5710)

It is the recommendation of the Administration that the Board of Trustees approve, for fiscal year 2026-2027, an increase of \$225 to the Support Staff Professional Development Allowance and an increase of \$250 to the Administrative/Professional Staff Professional Development Allowance.

A. Baldwin made a motion to approve the recommendation. D. Middleton seconded the motion.

Enrollment Report

Classes for the Fall 2026 Semester began on August 29. As of count date (9/8/26), 8,488 students are enrolled (5,608 part-time, 2,880 full-time).

We projected 79,039 contact hours for the fall semester and as of count date, we are at 109% (86,442 contact hours) of projection.

- **RENEWAL:** Articulation Agreement with Eastern Michigan University (EMU)
Delta Associate of Applied Science in Nursing (ADN)
EMU Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN)
This agreement is designed to provide a natural transition from the associate's degree to the baccalaureate level.
 - *Benefit to students:*
 - *3+1 agreement, up to 90 credits will transfer from Delta.*
 - *The 30 EMU credits can be completed within 12-24 months.*
 - *Reduced tuition, \$9,840 for the 30 remaining credits in the BSN completion program.*
 - *Convenient BSN online completion program for the working RN.*
- **NEW:** Articulation Agreement with Eastern Michigan University (EMU)
Delta College Associate in Applied Arts, Journalism & Integrated Media
EMU Bachelor of Science in Journalism or Bachelor of Science in Media Studies & Journalism

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Under this agreement Eastern will waive its rule that 60 hours must be completed at the university and allow Delta's entire degree, plus electives, to transfer and apply.

- *Benefits to students:*
 - *All three Delta tracks are transferable to the two EMU programs*
 - *Only 45 credits are needed at EMU to complete the BS*
 - *Courses are delivered in a hybrid format, both face-to-face and online*
- Weeks of Welcome – Supporting student engagement across all campuses, August 31 – September 24. A four-week experience designed to help students connect, navigate campus resources, and start the semester with confidence.
 - Week 1: Belonging – Students build connections, discover campus traditions, and find their place at Delta College. I enjoyed attending the cookout held in the Commons.
 - Week 2: Resources – Students explore the services and support available to help them succeed academically and personally.
 - Week 3: Engagement Beyond the Classroom – Students learn about clubs, leadership opportunities, events, and ways to get involved on campus.
 - Week 4: Bringing It All Together – Students celebrate their first weeks at Delta while reinforcing the tools and connections that support their success.

TRUSTEE COMMENTS

A. Clark had no comments to share this evening.

M. Wood thanked the presenters of both presentations and said it is good to see Delta continuing to support our students in all the different populations that we serve.

M. Wood also congratulated the five adjunct faculty that are now full-time faculty for this semester even though that may require more work for Associate Deans who may have to recruit new adjuncts.

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D. Middleton gave kudos to everyone who's helping our students manage life by removing barriers and having them focus on academics.

D. Middleton recognized Marcia Hulett-Jones for her nine years of service and congratulated Alison Ginter on her promotion. She said she's known Alison for a long time and is glad she was promoted.

D. Middleton said that she would be here on Friday for the Carlyon Gym Dedication and is looking forward to all the celebrations right through commencement in December.

M. Rowley had nothing to add to what was already said.

M. Nash was thankful for both presentations tonight. He acknowledged the police officer coins that were given to the Trustees.

A. Thomas said she has a niece that is a dual enrolled student who appreciates the opportunity.

A. Thomas appreciated Dr. Allmendinger and the staff that supported the African Cultural Festival this year.

She feels committed to the community college movement and community colleges across the country that represent that kind of hope.

Vice Chair Baldwin gave kudos to the staff for doing a good job of making sure that people feel like they belong. She spends a lot of time at the Downtown Saginaw Center and personally connects students with our staff.
