THE MISSION OF THE POSSIBLE DREAM PROGRAM

The Possible Dream Program was developed by Delta College to encourage students who are academically advantaged, but socioeconomically disadvantaged, to successfully complete school and then go on to realize the "dream" of a college education.

- The Possible Dream Program is a partnership among students, parents, community stakeholders and Delta College to encourage student's success in school and fulfill the goal of a college education.
- The program keeps students excited about learning and nurtures them toward a college goal. From program admittance through 12th grade, our "Dreamers" are offered the opportunity to participate in <u>free</u> enrichment and academic activities.

Nomination Criteria:

- The nominee has above average academic potential (2.5 GPA or above is a good standard)
- The student is financially eligible: receiving financial assistance (such as Medicaid, school lunch program, SNAP, MiChild, etc.)
- They have a **supportive adult** in their life to encourage participation
- The nominee is able to arrange transportation to one of the Delta College Campus Centers for activites (transportation is provided from Delta Main Campus, Delta Downtown Saginaw Center and Delta Midland Center)

Further consideration will be given to students who meet the above criteria and:

- · Are from a single parent home
- Would be a first generation college student

Frequently Asked Questions

How does my child get nominated to the Possible Dream Program?

Students can be nominated by teacher, counselors, principals or can choose to self-nominate with the recommendation of two school personnel. Selection is based on teacher recommendations, academic abilities and socioeconomic criteria. Students are selected from schools in Bay, Midland and Saginaw counties.

Does it cost money for my child to be in this program?

Admission and activities are free. There is no cost to become a member of the Possible Dream Program or to participate in activities. The Possible Dream Program is fully funded by the Delta College Foundation.

What kinds of activities do members of the Possible Dream Program participate in?

We offer our members a variety of activities that will broaden their horizons and keep them interested in pursuing higher education. Typical activity offerings include but are not limited to: test preparation and college preparation workshops; performances at area venues like the Dow Event Center and Midland Center for the Arts; STEM based workshops; computer/video game design workshops; leadership workshops; art camps and workshops; fitness festivals; and a variety of Delta College summer camps.

Events take place year-round, with the majority of activities taking place on evenings and weekends. Some events occur in a series, with 4 or more weekly occurrences; for example, our Financial Literacy series sponsored by Wildfire Credit Union includes self-paced online modules via Banzai, and a virtual meeting once per month during the school year. Times and dates for activities vary depending on the event.

How does transportation work?

We charter buses to transport Possible Dream participants to the activities. The buses pick up students at Delta campuses. We provide transportation to an event from campuses that are not in the county where the event takes place. For instance, if an event is held at the Dow Event Center in Saginaw, we would provide bus pick-up and drop-off from our Midland and Main Campus (Bay City) locations.

Will my child have to attend every event?

No, it is not required that your child attends every event. We encourage our members to take advantage of as many opportunities as possible.

How long are students in the program?

Students are able to participate in the Possible Dream Program from the time they are accepted into the program until they graduate from high school.

Can parents be chaperones for the activities?

No, we do not allow parents to chaperone Possible Dream activities. All of our chaperones are Delta College employees or Delta College student volunteers who have been background checked.

If my child changes schools, may he/she continue in the Possible Dream Program?

As long as your child attends school in Bay County, Midland County, or Saginaw County, they are eligible to continue in the program.

Does my child have to be receiving financial assistance to be in the program?

In order to participate in the Possible Dream Program, a child must be eligible to receive some sort of Federal or State assistance that is based on low income guidelines.

How long has the program been around?

The Possible Dream Program was founded in 1991. Our first class was inducted into the program in 1992. Since 1992, over 2,300 students in the Tri-Counties have participated in Delta's Possible Dream Program.

Possible Dream Program Overview

Since 1991, the Possible Dream Program at Delta College has promoted cultural awareness, academic achievement and higher education to academically promising students from low income households. Over 2,200 students have participated in the program since its inception.

We offer free, educational enrichment opportunities to students in middle school and high school, we encourage our students to stay focused, complete school and see that a college education is an achievable goal. Approximately 100 middle school students are selected for the program each year from applications received from students in Saginaw, Midland and Bay counties.

Program Goals

Retention: Encourage students to graduate high school and attend college.

Enrichment: Students participate in a variety of free activities that broaden their academic and cultural horizons.

Activities include:

- Test prep and study skills workshops
- Career workshops and summer camp scholarships
- Performances at the Dow Event Center and Midland Center for the Arts
- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) focused programming
- "Go See It"trips to area museums, the Whiting, the Fox Theater and more
- Exposure to Delta College and other college campuses (tours, activities on campus, mentoring)
- Scholarships to Delta College
- Assistance with the college process (applying, assistance with financial aid paperwork, registering for classes, etc.)

Students must meet the following criteria to be considered for the program:

- 1. Grades and/or test scores that demonstrate performance and potential (minimum grade average of 2.5).
- 2. Low income as defined by federal guidelines (see standards on application) or financial assistance eligible.
- 3. Thorough completion of the Possible Dream application.
- 4. Able to arrange transportation to one of the Delta College campuses for activities (campuses located in Bay, Midland, and Saginaw counties).

Further consideration will be given to students who meet the above criteria and:

- 1. Are from a single-parent home.
- 2. Would be a first generation college student.

Possible Dream Program Overview

Since 1991, the Possible Dream Program at Delta College has promoted cultural awareness, academic achievement and higher education to academically promising students who are at risk due to socioeconomic challenges. Over 2,300 students have participated in the program since its inception.

By introducing the program to students in middle school and continuing to offer educational opportunities through 12th grade, we encourage our students to complete high school and see that a college education is an achievable goal. Approximately one hundred middle school students are selected for the program each year from nominations received from schools in Saginaw, Midland and Bay counties.
