Assessment Reporting

Student Clubs/Organizations:

Delta College is proud of the selection of co-curricular opportunities available to its students. Among these are registered student clubs and organizations, campus life activities, alternative breaks, intramurals, heritage months and leadership development on a Delta College Campus. Our clubs/organizations provide meaningful experiences to participating members and the community at large. These programs and activities enhance student leadership and personal growth, affording students the opportunity to augment their formal education with experiences outside the classroom.

The below referenced service projects were completed during the 2017/2018-2019/2020 academic calendar. During the COVID Pandemic clubs/organizations were not able to meet in person or do service projects as a group. The one exception was that clubs could put together informational flyers to share with the college community. Clubs/Organizations started completing service projects once again at the start of the 2022/2023 Academic Year. One other challenge is getting all reflections from every group once they have been approved to complete a project.

Phi Theta Kappa Project/Peer Mentoring:

The College Project for Phi Theta Kappa is designed to help develop and strengthen a supportive working relationship between the chapter and the college administration. Each chapter can receive up to a 5 star rating and the implementation of a college project is mandatory for a chapter to receive the top rating. Support from administration is essential for all chapters and the project is key in creating an opportunity for chapter members and administration to work together. The college project is a way for each chapter to become one of the college's best allies. Delta College's Chapter developed and implemented the Next Step Pioneer Peer Program to help support the mission of the college. The mission, for the college,

is that Delta College collaborates to deliver and sustain an enriching education that empowers our diverse and inclusive community to achieve their personal, professional and academic goals. The Next Step Pioneer Program supports the mission by providing resources for students that will help them navigate through their college experience while achieving their personal, professional and academic goals.

The Next Step Pioneer Peer Program has been a key focus for the past 3 years and has allowed the chapter an opportunity to engage incoming students while creating an environment that is beneficial in helping them be successful and complete their educational goals.

The student mentors provide to their peers:

- helpful information about specific dates, scholarship and grant information, financial aid information and other college wide resources
- provide students with an individual that they have an opportunity to engage with and provide relationship building with from the beginning of their college experience
- created opportunities for incoming students to navigate their college experience with a designated champion who is focused on helping them be successful
- provided students with access to administration on campus

Number of Students Impacted:

- the inaugural year, the 2020/2021 academic year, had 72 students participate as mentees and 12 student mentors
- the 2021/2022 academic year increased by 56 students with 5 new student mentors
- the 2022/2023 academic year increased by 70 students and 13 new student mentors
- students said they learned the importance of staying positive and believing in yourself

Outcomes Noted by Students:

- felt connected because they always had a person they could reach out too
- students felt engaged in extracurricular programs
- students felt that they were successful in classes
- students during the COVID pandemic felt that this experience made their college experience more real because they had someone to reach out to about the institution

Challenges:

- the project started during COVID and ran fully online for the first two academic years
- engaging students online was an initial challenge but the student mentors created opportunities that were successful
- keeping all students, student mentors and mentees, engaged in the process throughout the fall/winter semesters
- administration staying engaged throughout the year with the process
- record keeping by individual student mentors

Student Leadership Academy:

Student Leadership Academy Expectations

The Student Leadership Academy is continually evolving to provide opportunities for students to gain leadership skills and abilities that promote success for them in their college journey and also as they navigate throughout their lives. The academy started off as a group of students and faculty that would meet monthly to discuss a topic that related to leadership. Since then, the academy has developed into a multi-faceted program that provides opportunities for all students to be involved in gaining and strengthening their leadership abilities. The students in the academy go through a leadership training that assists them in the development of their leadership skills by providing challenges to help them realize and understand their full potential. All Student Leaders also create opportunities for others who are not part of the academy develop leadership skills as well. The students have also been instrumental in creating a Homecoming Week for the college along with providing middle and high school students with a diversity symposium where they provide presentations to these students on many different topics. These students work from the very beginning of the planning stages and implement each of these programs while providing other opportunities to get students engaged in leadership development. The Student Leadership Academy strives in all areas by promoting the values of respect, accountability, open communication, sacrifice and fun. We have implemented a pre/post survey to track assessment of learning outcomes for the 2022/2023 academic year.

The Student Leadership Academy has had challenges as well. COVID impacted the group dynamics in great detail but after the initial shock of moving everything online the group adapted to a new normal. The academy students for the 2020/2021 and 2021/2022 academic years had to do everything virtually. This is no way slowed them down, one item that was evident though was that participation was not as consistent with the group when it was online. When the group was surveyed it was noted that students felt that it was not as big of a deal if they missed an online forum because they were able to go back and watch the recording. The positive that was found though was that if individuals were unable to meet specific times they were still able to participate just in a different way that had not been thought about before.

Learning Outcomes for the Student Leadership Academy

- 1. For students to understand their ability to initiate change and become change agents.
- 2. For students to understand their overall awareness of leadership, how to use their voice, how to speak up for change and how to be involved.
- 3. For students to be involved and engaged on campus.

Women's Inclusive Network:

This group was developed to create a safe place for woman to develop emotionally, intellectually and become stronger leaders. These students, staff and faculty go through a yearlong program that creates a supportive environment that then inspires and empower them to assist in increasing their self-esteem, positive relationships and becoming more self-aware. This group has consistently changed over the past 4 years and continues to develop. The mission of this program is to support, inspire and empower the women of Delta in a safe space to foster self-esteem, positive relationships and self-awareness. This group was developed to help the woman of today in their development of becoming strong and effective leaders. We have implemented a pre/post survey to track assessment of learning outcomes for the 2022/2023 academic year.

There have been some challenges which also have opened the door to opportunities. During the COVID Pandemic all meetings were held virtually. We as a group agreed that it was much more difficult to connect through an online platform than in person but we were also still able to meet which was imperative. The group dynamics have changed with a smaller attendance base since the pandemic but we will continue to learn, make changes and grow. We also understand as a group that having an online option is imperative to make sure that barriers are removed such as transportation for people to participate. Some individuals are full remote but still seek these experiences and since the pandemic we have observed that. Also, another challenge is people staying connected and attending meetings. We have had many changes in attendance since the pandemic and we are still focusing on the why and how to create a new established sense of belonging.

Learning Outcomes for the Women's Inclusive Network:

- 1. To learn to connect with other women who will help empower, build trust, build positive relations and self-awareness in a safe space.
- 2. To help women understand their strengths and how these strengths can be used in a positive way to gain influence over others and make changes when they are needed.
- 3. To help women understand that they cannot be healthy if they never invest in themselves.
